



# Croeso

Year 5/6 staff are looking forward to welcoming your child into their new class. As of yet, we are still unsure how our school will operate, however, here is some general information that we hope you will find useful.

## Start of Day Arrangements

School starts at 8:50am and all pupils are expected to arrive on time to avoid a late mark on the register. If your child is late for registration they must report to the main school office before going to their classroom so that their attendance can be recorded.

## End of Day Arrangements

All pupils will be dismissed through their classroom door. This will be the Demountable main door for both Year 5/6J & Year 5/6C classes and the Lower Building for Year 5/6S. In Year 5/6 we encourage pupils to leave the classroom independently and meet their parent/guardian at a specific meeting point that has been discussed and agreed between parent and child beforehand. If the person picking up your child is not at the agreed meeting point, pupils must return to their classroom where their teacher will assist. Year 5 pupils are not allowed to walk home on their own. Year 6 pupils must have signed consent to walk home independently.

## Meetings with Teachers

If you have an issue that needs to be discussed with the class teacher, please make an appointment. Minor issues e.g. doctors appointments; feeling unwell etc, can be dealt with in the main school office where any messages will be passed on to the teacher.

## HWB

All pupils have a Login & a password to access the HWB. It is important that you help your child to learn their Login & password as they will complete both home and school work using the learning platform as an effective tool.

## PE Kit

## Homework

- \* Numeracy/Literacy homework will be sent out on a Friday and pupils will be expected to return it by the following Monday.
- \* Homework Logs (Topic based homework) will be sent out on a termly basis. Pupils will be given four weeks, including a half term, to complete this work.
- \* Spellings/Times tables will be sent home every Friday to learn in preparation for a test on the following Friday.

## Reading

All pupils will be given a home/school reading book which will be changed regularly. It is essential that pupils bring their books to school on their **set day**. It is important that the children experience a broad range of text and should be encouraged to read other books in addition to their school reading books. All pupils will have access to the school library.

### What your child will need

#### Checklist

A small bag to fit a locker containing reading book, homework & P.E. Kit.	
Reading book & Reading Record to be brought on designated reading day.	
Black ink pen, pencils, coloured pencils, ruler and a rubber to be kept at home for homework activities. (Pupils do NOT need a pencil case in school)	
<b>PE Kit:</b> White shorts, Green School T-shirt, leggings/tracksuit bottoms and trainers. No jewellery please.	
All jumpers, coats and kit to be clearly labelled with child's full name & class.	

## Fruit Tuck Shop

Year 5/6 pupils take part in running the daily Fruit Tuck Shop as a business. All KS2 pupils have access to the Fruit Tuck Shop where they can purchase a fruit snack for 30p. Pupils may bring their own fruit snack if they prefer - No fizzy drinks or crisps please. In the juniors, pupils are to be responsible for their own snack money. They should have a safe place in their bags for this.
